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Empowering CHEs

Sustainable and scalable remuneration models for community health workers also known as village health teams (VHT) is challenge in Africa.

Healthy Entrepreneurs has extensive experience with highly motivated community health workers, with a retention rate of over 80% over the last 5 years. The entrepreneurial approach provides CHEs with the incentives, products and equipment that improve and sustain their functioning. It also significantly increased retention, motivation, and increased self-esteem.

Projects

a) HIV Self-Testing Pilot

HIV Self-Test (HIVST) – in partnership with PATH and the Ministry of Health (MOH), CHEs were trained to offer HIV Self-test services in Kyegegwa, Nakaseke, & Kyankwanzi.

Uganda is committed to achieving the 95 95 95 goals by 2030 and in so doing, strives to increase public access to HIV testing services and identification of HIV positive individuals.

b) Non-Communicable Diseases (Hypertension & Diabetes Services)

Healthy Entrepreneurs offers high level training to community health entrepreneurs, guided by the Ministry of Health in line with the national clinical guidelines. The trained CHE can provide hypertension and diabetes screening and offer treatment, services through tele consultation. The pilot is supported and supervised by the Ministry of Health, NCD department, is currently running in Mukono, Mityana and Kassanda.



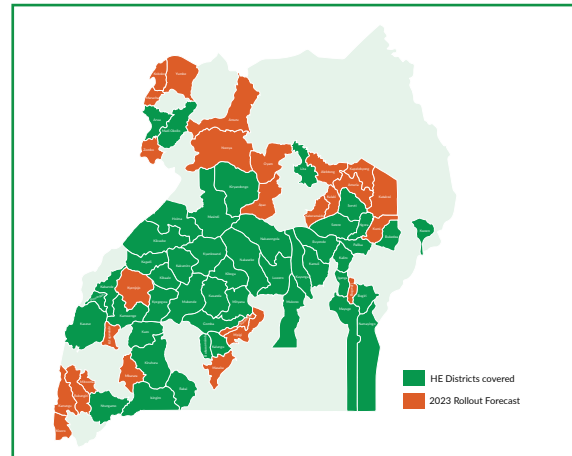

C) Training and support of new CHEs



4094 CHEs onboarded

b) d- Ebola emergency response and risk communication

Healthy entrepreneurs embarked on a responsive and pragmatic campaign to support the Ministry of Health's efforts to curb down on and arrest the spread of the outbreak in Kassanda and Mubende.

- HE supported the Ministry of Health in mapping out traditional healers
- Provided CHEs with free chlorine for sanitizing with Ebola prevention fact sheets
- Ensured supply of essentials products to our CHEs.
